How to Enter

Please read through the following instructions and make sure you have read the rules at the top of the section you are entering and at the back of the schedule.

Adult entries are 80p each in all classes. Children's entries are 50p each in all classes **apart from Class 1; Olympic Mascot which is free.**

- Use 1 entry form per person, there are 2 in this schedule, extras can be copied or downloaded from the website;

- Complete the entry form and put it into an envelope with the fee. Mark the envelope CREATIVE HOBBIES and hand it into the Show Caravan on the Civic Hall car park in the week prior to the Show.
- For each single entrant whose entries total £5.00 or more there will be a free entry ticket to the Show, to be collected from the marquee when the exhibits are delivered.
- Entries close THURSDAY 5.00pm before Show Day.

Delivery of Exhibits

- Exhibits must be delivered to the Creative Hobbies Marquee on Friday, 5.00pm – 8.00pm or Saturday, 7.00am – 8.00am on Show Day. The marquee will temporarily close at 8.00am on Show Day for judging, please make sure you have allowed time to display your entries.

Exhibits are the responsibility of the exhibitor.

Judging

- Judging is approximately between 8.00am and 10.30am when the marquee is temporarily closed to the public.
- The judge's decision is final.

Collection of Exhibits

- Collect exhibits between 4.30pm and 5.30pm on Show Day.
- Exhibits not collected by 5.30pm will be taken to the Show Office on the Show Ground and held for a further hour after which they will be disposed of.

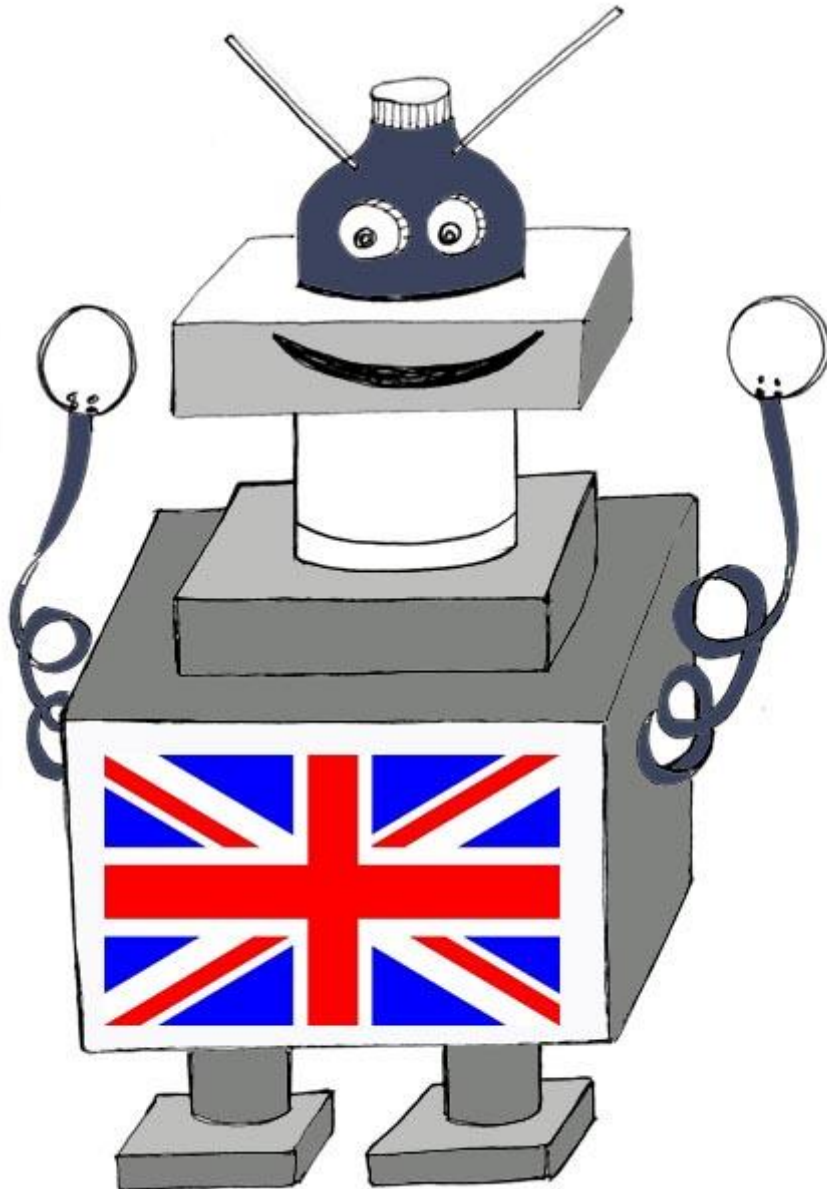

TIPS FOR PRESERVING

Our WI judge for preserves has very kindly offered a few tips when making and showing preserves

- Always label the jar with the full date to include the day, month and year
- Flavours of ingredients should complement each other with no single ingredient dominant
- If an unusual chutney or jam it is helpful to list the ingredients on the label at the back of the jar. Anything with a fiery kick must be mentioned.
- Chutney and other vinegar preserves should be left 2-3 months for the flavours to develop. After 12 months the chutney dries out and separates causing an unpleasant taste.
- Fruits should be evenly distributed, allow the mixture to cool slightly before bottling to prevent it rising to the top.
- **Lemon Curd** should have a breathable lid like a waxed disc and cellophane NOT metal. It should be kept in the fridge and made within 3 weeks of the show.
- **Chutneys and vinegar preserves** are better with plastic lined metal lids that will give an airtight seal.
- **Jams**, use either a waxed disc and cellophane or a metal lid, it is not necessary to use both.
- A plain lid is acceptable but fabric covers with ribbon or raffia make nice alternatives. Paper muffin cases with thin ribbon work well too.

- All wine must be made by the fermentation process, with no added commercial alcohol, except in the case of liqueurs.
- Bottles – wines should be exhibited in clear glass bottles, approximately 75cl capacity. Liqueur in ½ bottles.
- Airspace – should be between ½ - 1 inch below the bottom of the closure.
- Corks – white, plastic topped cork stoppers.

RECIPES

LIQUEUR RECIPE

- 1 x 75cl Gin or Brandy or Vodka
- 1 – 1 ½ lb fruit
- 1lb sugar
- Large, wide necked jar

Prick the fruit all over and put into the jar with the rest of the ingredients. Every two days shake the jar gently to encourage the sugar to dissolve. When fully dissolved, remove the fruit and siphon the liquid into clean, sterile bottles, avoiding the sediment. Liqueur can be drunk immediately but improves if left to mature.

APPLE WINE; medium/dry

- 3 litres PURE apple juice
- 1 litre PURE orange juice
- 19oz sugar Gervin Yeast No2
- 1 teaspoon yeast nutrient
- 1 teaspoon Pectolase

Empty the juices into a demijohn. Dissolve the sugar in ½ pint boiling water and add to the demijohn. Make up to 1 gallon with cold water. Add the yeast nutrient and pectolase and give a good shake. Add the Gervin yeast. When fermentation has slowed down, siphon off into a clean demijohn and let the fermentation finish. Siphon off into another clean demijohn, leaving all the sediment in the bottom. It can be drunk immediately but improved if left for a couple of months.

ELDERBERRY WINE; dry

- 3lb elderberries
- 2 ripe bananas
- 1 tsp Pectic enzyme
- 1 Campden tablet
- 1 tsp citric acid
- 1 tin red grape concentrate
- 1 tsp yeast nutrient 1
- vitamin B1 tablet
- 1 sachet of Burgundy yeast
- 1 kg sugar

Squash the berries, mash the bananas and pour 2 pints of very hot water (NOT BOILING) over them to cover and leave overnight. Add pectin enzyme and Campden tablet and leave for a further night. Add all other ingredients except the sugar and ferment in a bucket for 3 days. Strain off the liquid into a demijohn, then add the sugar which should be dissolved in 1 pint of boiling water. Top up the demijohn with water to 1 gallon. Fit an airlock and ferment out. Syphon off the sediment when the fermentation has finished into a clean demijohn. Leave to clear and mature. This wine can be drunk when it is clear and bright **but is better left to mature for 6 months.**
